Dear Keith,

As the faculty moderator of the JSO, I wanted to convey my concerns about the formation of a Fordham chapter of Students for Justice in Palestine. While I recognize the complexity of the conflict in Israel/Palestine and the legitimate grievances of Palestinians, I worry about the effect that the creation of this organization will have on the student body at Fordham and on the JSO in particular.

Up to now the JSO has been apolitical and has even been collaborating lately with the MSA on raising funds and assisting with translation for Syrian refugees being helped by the Hebrew Immigrant Aid organization (thanks to the encouragement of Jason Morris). But if the SJP is approved, the JSO has said they will come out as pro-Israel in opposition to the SJP.

The SJP takes extreme positions, not only supporting the BDS (Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions) against Israel but also calling for the repatriation of all Palestinians to their original homes (essentially denying Israel's right to exist) and an end to "the Israeli system of Apartheid."

I think approving this organization would be unfortunate at a time of so much political divisiveness and when, in contrast to the polarized political discourse, the Jewish and Muslim students at FCLC have begun to work together for a common cause.
