Re: Students for Justice in Palestine

On November 17, 2016, the Executive Board and Senate of United Student Government voted to pass Students for Justice in Palestine as a club at the Fordham University Lincoln Center Campus. United Student Government invited representatives from both Students for Justice in Palestine and the Jewish Student Organization to hear their perspectives and ask questions to both groups.

United Student Government is dedicated to the safety of all students and has faith that Students for Justice in Palestine can function on campus respectfully. Their presence will help to create a space for academic discussion and promote intellectual rigor on campus. We do not believe that the presence of Students for Justice in Palestine will take away from efforts to promote a safe environment on our campus.
